


Public Power San Diego

San Diegans pay among the highest electric rates in the country. Even worse, the rates are proposed to rise each year for the foreseeable future.


Public Power San Diego advocates for a community-owned, independently run, noprofit electric utility committed to locally produced and distributed clean and sustainable energy.


If you think your bills are high now, they will be rising each year into the future.

^{*}more than \$1 million/day profit is taken out of City of San Diego customers pockets — electricity rates would drop by going to no-profit public power



Public Power Lowers Rates

Every no-profit utility has lower rates than the forprofit monopolies: SDGE, PGE, SCE

No-profit utilities *gain local control of rates*

The only utilities to achieve 100% renewables so far are no-profit

Energy Democracy Helps Everyone

27% of SDGE customers are late in paying or we support them with subsidies due to high rates

All customers - homes, businesses and the city* would get lower bills


^{*}The city of San Diego spends more than \$20 million on its own electricity bills and could cut it's bills by 20% (that is also taxpayer funds that would be saved)

What goes into our electricity rates*?

- Generation
- Transmission (guaranteed profit)
- Distribution
- WildFIRE Fund Charge
- Subsidies (public purpose programs)
- \$DGE profits
- \$DGE taxes
